## Identifier Chart

Print out this handy sheet to help identify the bright and colourful flowers in your garden or local park!



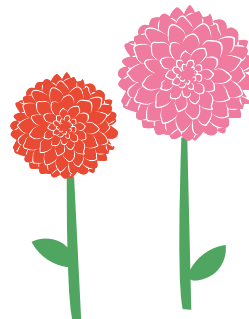
BLUEBELL

These have purple petals and hang like a bell.



DAFFODIL

Blossoming in early to late spring, daffodils have wide yellow or white petals around the edge, and trumpet-like ones in the centre.



DAHALIA

You might find dahlias that are white, yellow, red, pink or purple. They are bushy with pointed petals.



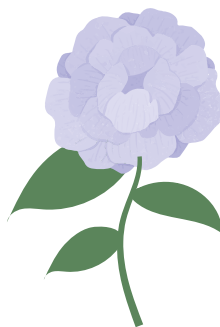
DAISY

With white or sometimes pink petals and a yellow centre, daisies are often found in areas of grass.



DANDELION

These have bright yellow petals with jagged edges. They turn into fluffy white/grey seed heads that blow away in the wind to grow in a new spot.



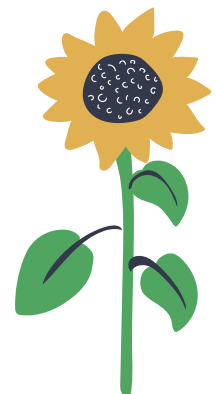
HYDRANGEA

The flowers on a Hydrangea grow in large clusters and can be pink, blue, white, purple – the colour depends on the type of soil it grows in.



POPPY

These have striking red petals and are often found where soil has been disturbed.



SUNFLOWER

With yellow petals, the sunflower looks like the sun and has a dark centre.
